Willunga National Trust has just been told that it will receive a further grant from the History Trust of SA, for the next stage of the **Slate Museum** - a display about transporting slate, titled "Heavy Hauling: Horses, Bullocks, Rails and Sails" which will also include a much-needed audio-visual component. Work will start soon on the first stage - preparing the walls and slate flooring. We particularly **want** the floor to be **irregular slabs of slate**, rather than square and uniform, so if anyone has any old-style slate slabs which they could contribute, the Branch would be very grateful.

10th Pancake Day 2007...

UnitingCare's Pancake Day provides an opportunity for people within the community to register and hold a Pancake Day event to support the less fortunate members of our community. It is a fun event that raises funds to help UnitingCare provide practical support and advocacy to more than one million people.

This year a stall will again be held at the **Willunga Quarry Market** on Saturday, February 10th. Come and enjoy a piping hot pancake with yummy toppings ie maple syrup, golden syrup for the aussies(!), jam or lemon and sugar all for only \$2. Stack of 2 for \$3.50, stack of 3 for \$5.

Funds are distributed to UnitingCare agencies to help allevi-

ate poverty and disadvantage in Australia. Poverty is about lacking the means to live a decent life. It's about not having enough money to eat healthy food, gain adequate housing, and remain healthy physically and mentally. Caring first for those who need it most is an expression of the compassion of God. We believe God calls us to care for each other and particularly those who are marginalised or vulnerable.

Shrove Tuesday (Pancake Day) gets its name from the ritual of shriving that Christians used to participate in the past. Shriving is asking for a pardon for wrongdoings and sins. Shrove Tuesday is a day of Celebration as well as repentance, because it is the last day before Lent. (Lent is the name used for the 40 days before the death of Jesus Christ). Lent is also the time of abstinence, a time of giving up things.

Shrove Tuesday was the last chance to spoil oneself, and use up the foods that were not allowed to be eaten during Lent.

In the old days there were many foods that would not be eaten during Lent: such as meat and fish, eggs and milky foods. So that no food was wasted, families would have a feast on the shriving Tuesday and eat up all the food that would not last the forty days of Lent without going off.
