This group fought hard for Willunga by lobbying the Willunga District Council and government, for such things as keeping the majority of our residential blocks no smaller than 1000 sq m and having a safe school crossing on Aldinga Rd. They also lobbied hard to retain Willunga police station in 1993. Unfortunately, this group dissolved due to lack of support.

Today you have the **Rural Hills South Community Forum** where your councillors and officers from the Onkaparinga City Council and your local and state members of parliament keep you updated on developments, challenges and changes within the Willunga District. It is a place for you to initiate or join in discussion. It is definitely a very important place for YOU as a Willunga and district resident to have YOUR say.

Autumn is the time of the year to plan for spring colour in your garden. During the Easter long weekend set aside a little time to prepare spaces in your garden for spring bulbs such as daffodils, Dutch iris and tulips.

On 14 April, the Saturday after Easter from 9am to 1pm at the Willunga Quarry Market there will be plenty of time to select a bulb collection. Bulbs can be planted any time now, they won't require watering until Mother nature provides winter rain, and it will be a few years before they will need dividing. The good oil on sweet peas is that, this Autumn is ideal for later plantings. Gawler strain sweet peas are available from the donut seller, who is a recognised successful hybridist of these beautiful spring flowers.

Take home homemade snacks to enjoy during a coffee break. The selection of sweet and savoury biscuits, Greek cakes and biscuits and the variety of baking available from the Uniting Church fund raising stall are always popular. For the health conscious, pure fruit wraps and Willunga almonds are very enticing. Gluten free biscuits and sugar free jams are also on sale.

As the nights get cooler thoughts about spinning and knitting may come to mind. Choose coloured fleece, home spun alpaca, mohair or sheep's wool, for the next 'do it yourself project' from stall number 20.

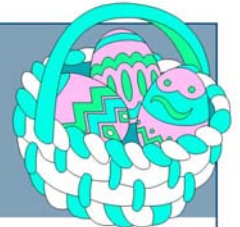

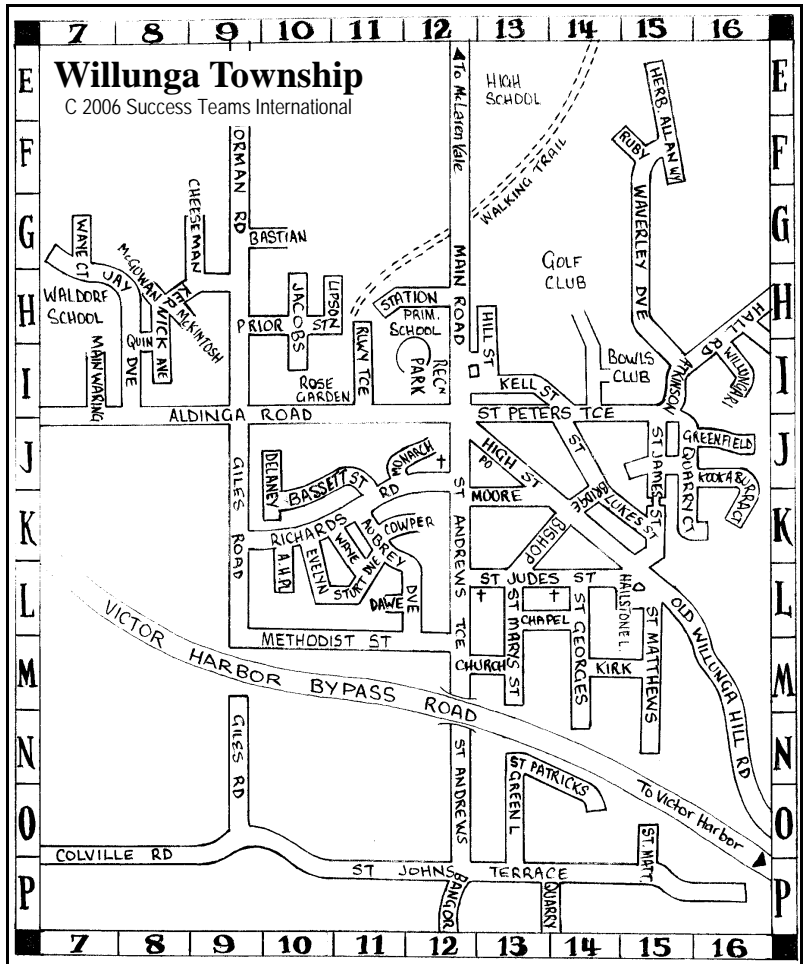
