The Willunga Branch was formed in 1968 and is part of a network of nearly 50 National Trust Branches in S A. Financially, the Branch relies on fundraising, donations, Museum admissions and specificpurpose grants for projects. The Courthouse building was restored and opened in 1970. It was used continuously as a Police Station/Courthouse from 1856 to 1929. The Slate Museum in the stables was opened in 2005 and is now being extended.

Willunga National Trust's vision is to help preserve and enhance the natural and cultural heritage of the Willunga District through information, education, interpretation and practical action, and by contributing to heritage and environmental tourism.

Willunga Branch PRIORITIES are...

1) Management of the old Police Station and Courthouse buildings, the adjacent nature Reserve, and the Bassett Boys Schoolroom, which are leased from the City of Onkaparinga

2) Telling and interpreting our history at the Slate Museum and the Courthouse Museum, and also via publications, pamphlets and walking trail guides.

3) Advocacy on heritage issues in the local community

4) Maintaining the local and family history archives at the Courthouse.



The **Courthouse Museum** is an authentic 1860s Courtroom with prisoner and jury boxes, cells and exercise yard - great for a spontaneous family role play! 
