NEETO, the third orchestra founded, coached and directed by Wendy, was formed to give adult beginners the opportunity of playing together. NEETO (the name stands for 'never, never, ever, too old') rehearses on Friday evenings and performs four times a year in the studio. There is no coaching fee,

but plenty of help to improve the playing, and lots of fun. Amateur means 'lover of an occupation' and there is no doubt that these three orchestras have plenty of that! Groups of Wendy's violin students also play in the Quarry and Farmers' markets, Almond Blossom Festival, Community Carols and recently in the Wooden Boat Festival in Goolwa.

Wendy is an ardent believer in the Suzuki method, and the success of this method shows clearly in the groups and orchestras. She has been teaching violin and viola in the Sellicks and Wil-






