Showcasing Willunga Recreation Park...

What a wonderful asset the Willunga community has in the wide and varied facilities owned by Willunga Recreation Park (WRP). The list of amenities has expanded over the years from the original oval with its heritage style grandstand to the last impressive addition of the new tennis / netball courts in the northwest corner, adjacent to the school.

The grounds and buildings have been purchased and managed by the people of Willunga. At times, local councils and the state government have helped with grants but largely the local community has been in control and funded the ongoing project known as the Wil-Recreation Park.



The ethos of our original purchase of the land was to provide a playing field where people could play and relax. This has certainly been a successful venture.

Another ongoing aim is to provide a wide and varied list of sports to loaffordably as possible. This is not easily achieved in this day and age especially with such huge increases in electricity and water costs.

The traditional strengths of WRP rest with sports such as football, basketball, netball and cricket, all of whom have enjoyed many successes over the years. However, in more recent times other sports have been included under the umbrella of WRP. They include badminton, volleyball and table ten-

We have many locals who have 'cut their teeth' playing at Willunga and then went on to play in the big time. Throwing on the boots for Willunga in the 1920's was Taffy Waye, who eventually played for Sturt | and won two Magarey Medals.

Willunga Recreation Park does not cater solely for sports people. Other local groups



who use the facilities include Guides, martial arts, folk dancing, chess and theatre sports. The grounds are used by the Willunga Quarry Market every month, with a focus on arts and crafts, fresh produce and plants, while the Old Show Hall's revamp and updated interior (from money raised from an Almond Blossom Festival) has meant that many local actors have used it as a forum for performances of theatre sports and plays.

Many in the community may not be aware that when the Police Station in Willunga closed, WRP committee took the opportunity to purchase both the building and accompanying land, which adjoins 'Rec Park', at a competitive price. The building was rented out for approximately 4 years as accommodation but is now being used as a music teaching school, which is again helping increase the arts in the district.





The Willunga Almond Blossom Festival's purpose has always been to provide the finances to make Willunga's recreation grounds a better place for Willunga residents.

Our recreation grounds are very special for a couple of reasons that this writer knows of... firstly they are one of the few town grounds that are owned, financed and controlled by the local residents and secondly, we are one of the few South Australian towns to be blessed with oval, grounds, courts and a public hall/sports stadium within a hundred yards of the town's centre.

Beginnings... Eight acres were purchased from Susanna Pethick in 1876 by the Willunga Recreation Grounds Committee for £12.00 per acre, £50 having to be borrowed.

The grounds were developed over ensuing years to include the stone Show Hall, and a large timber (undressed tree trucks) and iron structure, alongside, that was still in existence until the current Stadium was built in 1979. A number of other buildings for housing displays of animals and craft were erected around the grounds most notably in the area where the Quarry Market is now held (The booth's three small windows you can see in the photo above were for ticket collectors).

Until 1968, the grounds were owned and operated by the Willunga, Aldinga, Noarlunga & McLaren Vale Agricultural and Horticultural Society Inc. After some heated wrangling between the different town interests, ownership passed to the Willunga recreation Park Committee.

The First Almond Blossom Festival... Willunga's first Almond Blossom Festival was held in 1970 and was considered "a great success" despite the fact that the SA Tourist Bureau refused to support it "because...(Willunga) could not hold a Festival with success." The festival ran over ten days with over 1000 lunches provided to bus groups by the people of Willunga. Historical photos and papers were displayed at the courthouse, antiques at St Stevens Church hall, as well as an art show, displays of local produce and almond cracking machinery, cookery demonstrations, a drama night and two variety concerts.

The fair day programme was extensive and included the street procession, marching girls, and wood chopping contests, folk dancing, and displays of radio controlled aeroplanes, vintage cars plus sideshows as well as all the food booths. The most popular girl in the district (votes placed in boxes around the district prior) was crowned Miss Almond Blossom at the Almond Blossom Ball.

Since then... The Almond Blossom Festivals were timed to the blossom season, which meant their share of wet and cold weather and good and bad takings. "The early committees had much to learn... one year the committee was devastated by flu...another year one member kept buying up food... one year the marquee was not very water tight and heavy rain produced the hilarious use of umbrellas by visitors inside..." But despite these challenges and the heavy work loads encountered by those involved, much was achieved over the ensuing 10 years...

Wision & work pays off... In 1979, the many fund raising activities including the Almond Blossom Festivals resulted in the opening of the new stadium at a cost of \$183,000. \$30,000 came from Festival fund raising, \$20,000 from the RSL's sale of its previous premises, a CWA contribution of land (entrance), \$40,000 from the Education Department to use facilities and the rest from a bank loan... very big in those days!

The Future... Population, cultural and personnel changes as well as the loss of the almond industry have presented many challenges to the running and maintaining of "Rec Park", but community spirit, vision and commitment to our children and their children can overcome any future obstacles. I hope this very brief and incomplete history' spurs you on to do your bit for "the town".




