Community forums...

So that you can be informed and have your say in present and future development and direction of your area, Council has set up community forums for each ward. The Wine coast has two.



Rural Hills South Forum...

Your forum is the Rural Hills South Community Forum. At present it meets quarterly (four nights a year) at the Willunga Hub.

Forum meetings are open to all members of the public and are attended by local council representatives, including councillors and staff, local and federal MP's (when possible), and invited speakers.

Forum content...

Council members and MP's report on latest items of local interest. A speaker is often called in to speak to specific issues.

Important issues are often carried over a number of meetings.

There is ample opportunity for questions and commentary from the public attendees. Topics you would like addressed should be provided to the chairman prior to the meetings.

Music Education for the Under Fives...

Mini-Musicians is an early childhood music programme which gives children from 18 months to 5 years a fun and active introduction to the joys of music. The philosophy is based on the Orff-Schulwerk approach in which the starting point is the child.

Carl Orff was a German composer who devoted much of his life to developing a style of teaching music which got back to the basic elemental music of children's songs and nursery rhymes, speech work, percussion pieces "name-calls," movement and dance.

The Orff approach to Music Education is essentially a practical one, in which the teacher is a facilitator of the children's learning, providing the programme as a framework. The programme includes speech rhymes, storytelling, singing, percussion instruments (bar instruments and non pitched percussion), improvisation, movement, miming and listening. As well as offering the children ways of self-expression, the programme develops children's social, language, sequencing and memory skills, concentration and co-ordination.

This approach is practiced in general classroom music in pri-



mary and secondary schools as well as in areas such as music therapy and special education. It provides children with a solid foundation from which they can branch out with confidence in the future.

OLIVE FRANCES READER

Born 28th January 1936 in Cleethorpes, Lincolnshire
Died 24th June 2007 McLaren Vale Hospital, South Australia



Olive Frances Phillipson was one of the first women to study fulltime and to graduate with a Certificate of Agriculture from Kesteven Agriculture College in Lincolnshire, England. She then worked fulltime on a dairy farm for four years afterwards becoming the proprietor of a poultry farm, running it single handed for three years. She also worked part-time with a Market Research Group dealing with Services in a Council area; visiting people in their homes for them to complete the necessary forms and was a volunteer driver with meals-on-wheels. She was a member of the Young Farmers Public Speaking team for the County of Lincoln, England and Chairperson of the Young Conservatives Gainsborough Branch, Lincolnshire.

In 1961 she married Brian Reader and shortly after moved to South Australia where she lived for three years whilst her husband served here in the Royal Air Force; in 1971 she emigrated to Australia with her husband and their three sons.

For three years from 1972 to 1975 Olive worked part-time as a Drug Educator in the Health Education Unit of the Health Department of South Australia. In 1974 she joined the South Australian Education Department as a School Assistant where she made her mark as organiser of the Initial Learning Assistance Programme (L.A.P.) at Hackham South Primary School, recruiting and supervising parents to work one-to-one with children requiring special attention. Many young people benefited from her work. She retired from the Department in 1996.

Olive perceived that the Southern Region was missing out on Country & Regional Arts opportunities and the decision to exclude the general public from access to Noarlunga Theatre exacerbated this. It was Olive who led the charge to try and overturn this decision. When this failed she helped to develop Regional Arts in the Southern Region through the formation of Southern Theatre & Arts Supporters (S.T.A.R.S.). Her goals were to develop opportunities for young performers, particularly young women, local artists in all media and to foster community participation in the arts.

Olive's lasting legacy was in securing Waverley Homestead in Willunga which has allowed S.T.A.R.S. to develop broad based arts events. Young people in particular benefit from this facility through performing for the local community. Regular events include musical performances, dancing, art exhibitions & concerts. The main area of Waverley Homestead has now been named the Olive Reader Room to Olive's memory.

The Southern Community is indebted to Olive who will always be remembered as a woman of passion, leadership and vision. She is survived by her husband Brian, sons Stuart, David & Karl, daughters-in-law Carol, Emma & Amanda & grandchildren, Jack, Jasmine, Alexander & Olivia & her very many great friends in the Willunga & Fleurieu District.
