A NEW site... The extra information has made www.WillungaFestivals.com unwieldy to use, but we are hoping to very soon have financial and extra volunteer support to build a new site that will cover both aspects and be

very easy to navigate.

The Newsletter...

The "Willunga Informer" began in 1973. It was edited by Martin Dunstan and published by Willunga Recreation Park. After Martin left the district, the "InaNutshell" was started in 1975 to promote the Almond Blossom Festival. Between 1975 and 1990 the InaNutshell was produced, collated, stapled and hand delivered by a variety of Willunga women most notably Beverly Miller (We'll give you more detail in future editions).

InaNutshell was reintroduced by Joan Turner in 2002. In late 2006 we responded to Joan's request for someone to take it on and produced our first edition in February 2007.

Whilst Joan kept InaNutshell close to its original format (to enable quick set up), we felt an upgrade could make it more useable for and suited to Willunga's current needs.

Our aim is also to integrate it with the Willunga website... particularly to reduce doubling up on the work load.

The upgrades to InaNutshell have been well received and effective circulation has more than doubled.



Willunga Station...

As from and including Thursday, August 1, 1968, the Willunga station will become an unattended station. F.E.W. Martin, Secretary, SA Railways

Tast Train Journeys...Two trains pull our of Adelaide Railway Station in the coming week on sentimental



last journeys to Willunga. The section of line from Hallett Cove to Willunga will close down on Wednesday. The Australian Railway Historical Society has organised a special day train trip to leave Adelaide on the 34 mile run to Willunga at 12.45 pm on Sunday, returning at 5.30 pm. A night journey will be made on Wednesday, leaving at 6.22 pm, and arriving back in Adelaide at 10.45 pm. Two engines, withdrawn from service and now retained specifically for the society, will make the trips - the Duchess of Gloucester on Sunday and RX 207 Wednesday . The society's tour organiser, Mr. Dean L. Harvey, said today the engine on the Wednesday night journey, was of the same type used on the original run when the line was opened from Brighton to Willunga on

January 21, 1915. Mr. Harvey said seats were available to the public. People should ring 78 3003 or call at 41 Main Road, Belair to buy tickets.,

The Railways Department did not handle bookings for these excursions. Fares were \$3.20 for adults and \$1.20 for children on Sunday, and \$2.60 and \$1 on Wednesday.

Salute To The End Of An Era...

On a recent Sunday, hundreds of people crowded into a steam train. Hundreds more followed its course by road, and others crammed vantage points on the 34 mile route from Adelaide to Willunga to pay tribute to a railway service that had served the South for 50 years.

The lucky train travellers, in a motley variety of dress, scrambled on board by 12.45, and so started a journey that will live in my memory for years.

They were young and old, smart and scruffy, bearded bods and mothers to be, kids and grandpas. Everybody, everybody's friend for a day.

There were lunches en route, cold beer in the buffet and the Guards had new flags, shiny shoes and freshly creased pants.

The mighty steam locomotive, belching smoke, black as the devil himself, whistled defiantly at every crossing, brakes hissing, and going clackety clack over the rails.

And then the photographers cameras of all shapes and sizes. Hordes of picture-takers lining up like an army at bay to shoot pictures and films of a monster of steel and wheels that will soon, like "Puff the Magic Dragon", hide away and be lost in dreams.

Yes, it was a day to remember. A host of waving hands from young and old to bid goodbye to an engine powered by steam and coal, whose wheels may never again ride its shiny tracks of steel from Adelaide down Willunga way.

After that, Archie perspired up and down that line countless times. In those days, firemen really were firemen. They stoked, slaving over a hot footplate, losing a lot of weight - but according to Archie, they kept very fit. At 78 he's a lively soul with a sense of humour - and rarin' to go on that last trip. 


