Willunga's Christian Heritage...

If one word was to be used to describe the culture of Willunga's settlers, it is Christianity. The numerous church buildings, some now put to other uses and our street names are obvious indicators of our founders' intentions and beliefs.

South Australian settlement was an experiment unique in Australia... promoted and championed by Christian men and organisations as an opportunity to produce a Christian society free of the class struggles and ill effects of the industrial revolution in England.

The early settlers to the Willunga district were middle class Englishmen; in the main, Anglican. The slate industry which established Willunga as a viable town in its early years brought an influx of Cornish and Welsh, the vast majority being strong nonconformists... primitive Methodists, Wesleyans, Presbyterians, Congregationalists etc.

Their first services; Anglican, nonconformist and Catholic were held under the massive red gums or in individuals' houses, but it didn't take long for substantial stone houses of worship to be built.

Willunga's Christians today...

That this strong Christian foundation continues today, is evidenced by active church communities and Sunday church attendance... most notably the Uniting, Catholic and Anglican parishes. But this is just touching the surface, as these Christian communities provide a wide variety of activities supporting our youth, families, men, women and our elderly.

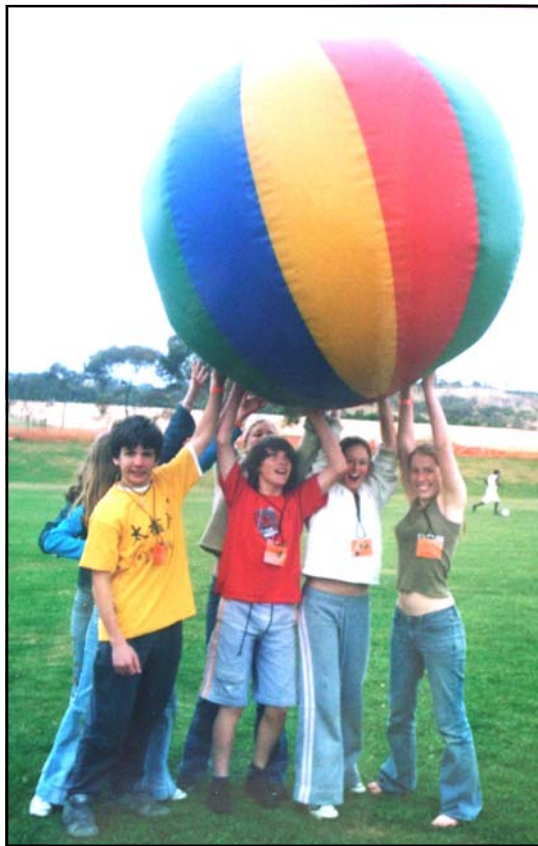

Trevor Desmond made a special presentation to Bob Bastian for his great help in volunteering many hours to do numerous maintenance tasks.

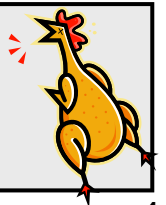

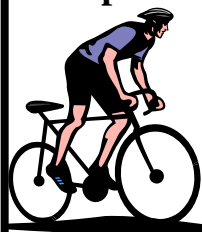

An update of Tour Down Under 2008...



The 2008 Tour Down Under is now firmly in the minds of the Willunga townsfolk following a highly successful and well attended pre-event launch last month.

Held at the recently refurbished Christina's on High Street (formerly Willy Hill Cafe), the majority of the town's 32 Sponsors were present to hear positive remarks from Mayor Lorraine Rosenberg; a Tour update from Arthur Hodgson (Operations Manager, Events SA); information from Sue Caporn about The Green Room's Fashion Parade on Race Day; and concluding with a three-song rendition by the highly-talented Julia Henning of Imagenel.

And it was Hodgson's remarks that got the room abuzz with positive energy. "If you thought the past nine years was big, you can now look forward to more cyclists, greater TV exposure and increased visitation to the regions," said Hodgson.

Today, in the Southern Vales Parish with four centres, each with its own church at Aldinga, Old Noarlunga, McLaren Vale and Willunga, church times vary. St. Stephens opted for a 5.30pm service on Saturday night. Our activities here are somewhat limited, but we work as a Parish, each supporting one another in the various functions held.

Sunday Schools are held each Sunday at St. Ann's, Aldinga on South Rd and at St. Margaret's, McLaren Vale during the Service time.

Both Aldinga and McLaren Vale have a Women's Guild, and the facility to store goods for Jumble Sales which are held three or four times a year.

A Parish Women's Fellowship group from the four centres, meets monthly. Their main objective is to supply baby wear and knee rugs for the various agencies who look after young mothers, the elderly and migrants coming to our country, where their climate is hotter than ours, and they feel the cold.

There is a Parish Mother's Union Branch, which is part of a World Wide organisation, founded in England 120 years ago. We meet monthly, moving round the Parish for our meetings.

The men are catered for by various interesting outings, usually in the evenings to somewhere fairly local and close.

At St Stephens this year, there will be a Service on Christmas Eve at 11.30 pm and the following Sunday, December 30th at 10 am, we will celebrate the Patronal Festival of St. Stephens followed by a shared lunch under the Pepper Tree.

We hope you will be able to join us in the celebrating 123 years of the Church of the second St. Stephens in Willunga.

Fr. Charles Gauci is the Parish Priest. Also, at present we have a Priest in Residence, Fr Tom Gleeson who can also be of assistance. Fr Tom also holds retreats and mediation sessions with people in need.

We have very active parish groups in Aldinga, Normanville and Willunga, with Mass held in all three churches every weekend. Youth Group meets Friday fortnightly includes outings and coffee shop.

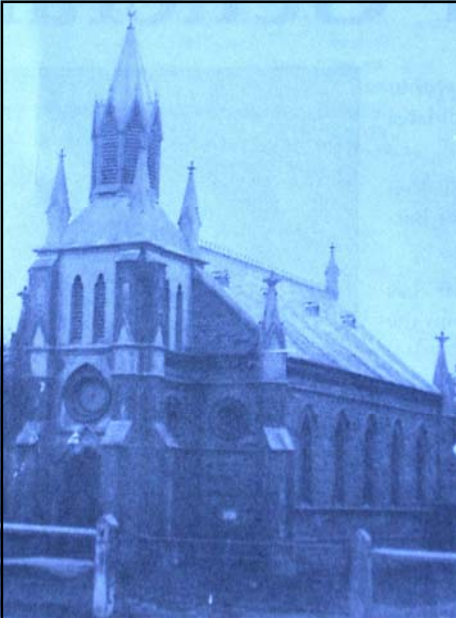
Adult fellowship group meet with many guest speakers and outings throughout the year.

Willunga Churches... a long history

Willunga Anglican Parish 1848-2007



The first Church of St Stephen was built early in 1848, on two acres of land on Aldinga Road, donated by Richard Hill, for a church and cemetery.

A Government grant of 150 pounds was given to build a church (in the cemetery) and parsonage, (St. John's Terrace), and together with donations from settlers, allowed a start to be made. The church, which seated 100 was consecrated in 1849.

The first rector, Arthur Burnett, brought out from England a bell, a wooden processional cross, and a wooden pulpit. The bell hung from a tree in the cemetery by the first church, and is now in the tower of the present St Stephens and is rung for services and weddings. The cross is still used. The pulpit was restored and placed in the present church, but sadly was given away.

As time went by, the church became too small and plans were set to build another church in the town. At the same time the

people in Aldinga began to make plans for the building of a Church there, so Willunga plans were put on hold. The Church of St. Ann, Aldinga opened in 1867.

In the 1880's another move was made, to build a church in the township, and the ladies ran functions to raise money and eventually the present St. Stephens Church was erected on a block of land brought from Captain Atkinson, at a cost of 30 pounds. The Church was completed in 1884, and dedicated by Bishop Kennion on July 6th, 1884.

The clergy had long distances to travel on horseback, to Myponga over Sellicks Hill on the old road, and often done at night, when there was a full moon, up to The Meadows, Noarlunga and to the coast.

Willunga Catholic Parish 1850-2007

The early days of settlement in Willunga were difficult and the diversity of the people is shown in their choice of religious affiliation. The first Mass in Willunga was celebrated (probably in a private home) in 1845 by Bishop Murphy. A collection was taken to build a church. A total of £72.10/- (\$145) was raised, and eventually an architect employed. Total cost was estimated at £350 (\$700) for a skeleton building only and the first stone was laid in 1846.

On the same day foundations were also made for a cottage presbytery and during this time donations kept coming although people were far from affluent. By 1850 the skeleton building was completed and on May 5th 1850 the church was consecrated and opened and St Joseph's, Willunga had begun!

Over the years the parish (whilst still large today) has shrunk consid-

erably in size. It used to take in Morphett Vale and Kangaroo Island, now we include McLaren Vale, McLaren Flat to the north, Aldinga to the west and Normanville, Yankalilla and Cape Jervois to the south.

Blessed Mary McKillop started her first Catholic Country school in Yankalilla in 1867, and less than a year later opened St Joseph's School at Willunga. In later years we have strongly supported Cardijn (our local Catholic Secondary School) and now luckily have Galilee at Aldinga which is an exciting experience for us all. Today we are also fortunate to have a fulltime youth worker attached to both Willunga and Noarlunga/Seaford Parishes along with Cardijn. We have had 30 previous Priests in this time and our present Parish Priest Fr. Charles Gauci is our 31st. All through this time people involved in the parish have been very busy in their support of each other, the local church and people far less fortunate than themselves.

Normanville and Willunga have large cemeteries attached to them, with both having recently been restored. Willunga has had the cemetery enlarged and the new area has been landscaped with a modern touch to include burial tastes for most people.

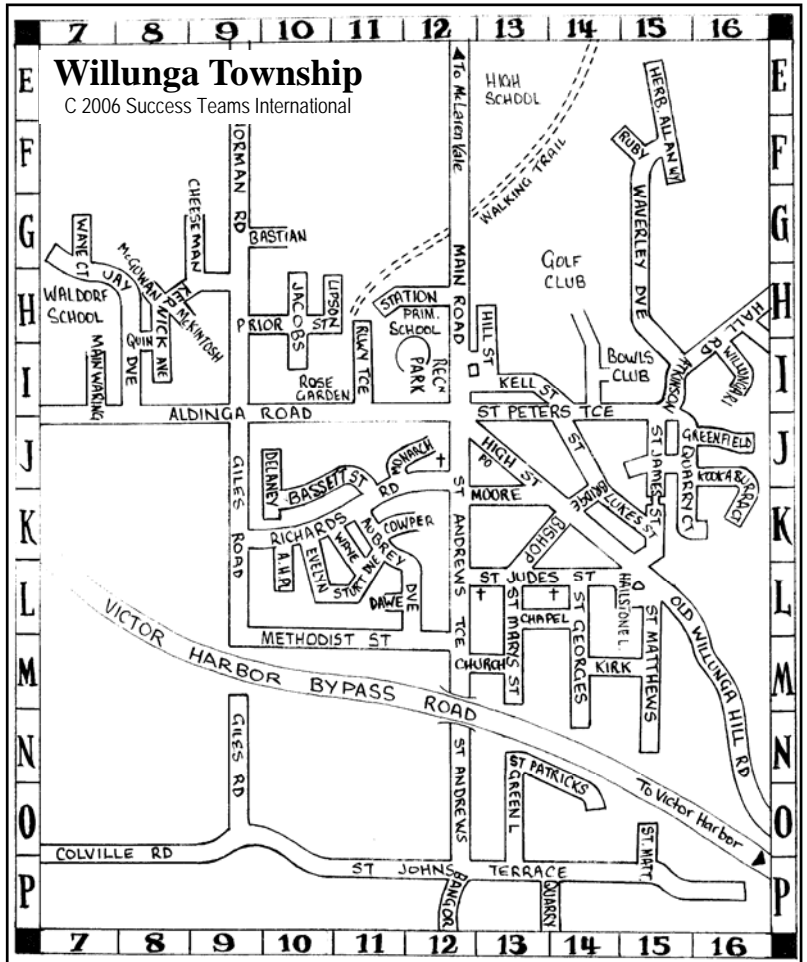

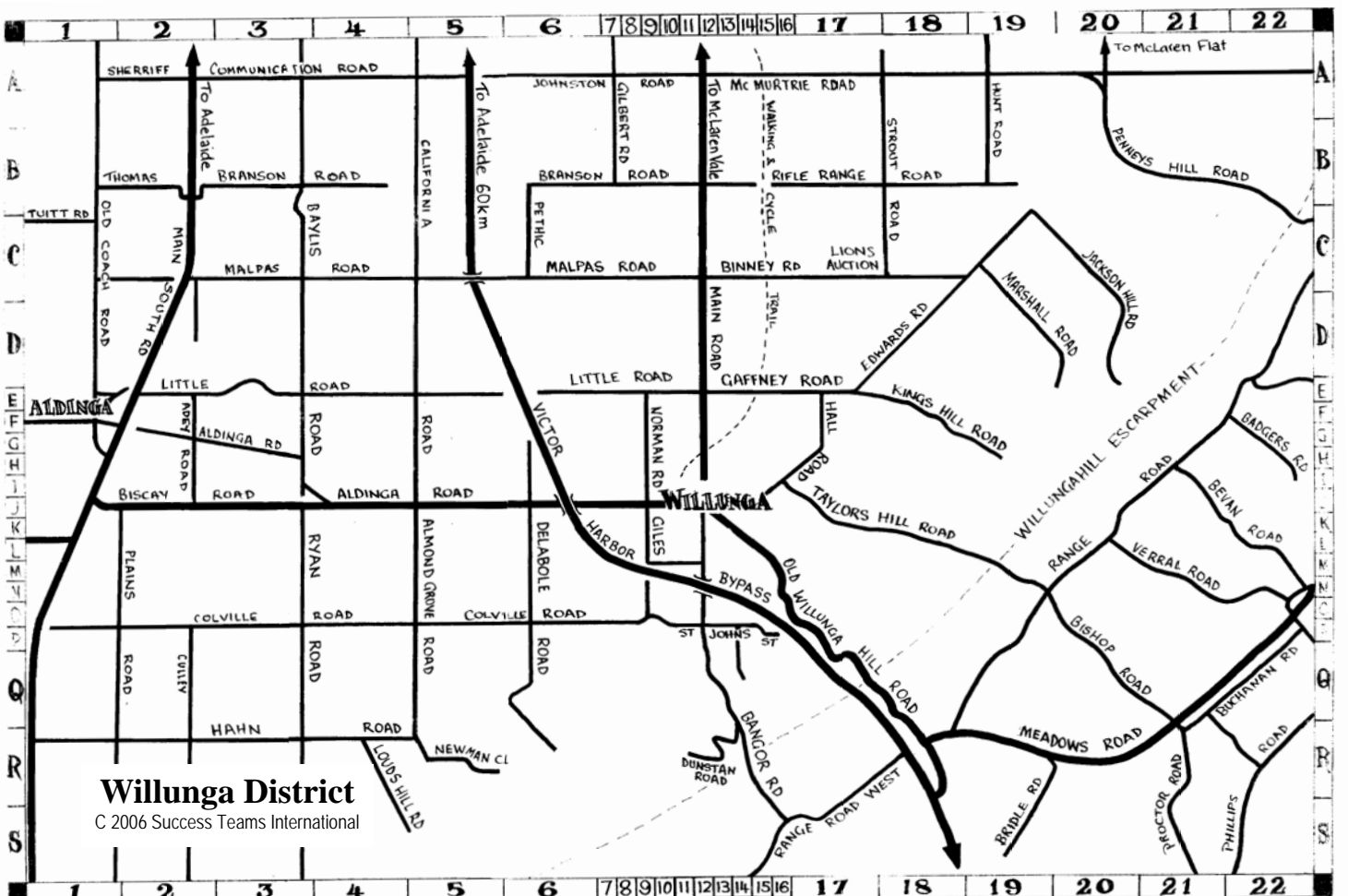
