

Native Animal Network is a voluntary, non-profit organisation concerned with the care of sick, injured and orphaned animals.

As well as providing information to members and the general public on native animal care, the Network also rescues animals in distress.

Other Network activities... Intensive care nursing of sick, injured or orphaned joeys; Workshops and seminars on care and handling of injured and orphaned native animals; Visits to schools and institutions; Quarterly meetings with guest speakers, exchanging knowledge and experiences; A quarterly magazine covering technical aspects as well as matter of general interest.

Donations... A 100% of all donations go to the animals, for such things as large Vet bills that can occur with some of the injured animals that are rescued.



How you can help... Strategic Plan for future...

The Willunga Recreation Park Committee with the assistance of the City of Onkaparinga has been working on a Strategic Plan. There is a view that the current capacity of the Recreation Park has been reached and plans need to be put in place to secure its continued future as it is the belief that without an injection of funding and a forward plan the Park will be at risk in meeting future demands. The goal of the Willunga Recreation Park Committee is to continue to provide a community managed and independently run recreation facility that offers the opportunity for the people of Willunga and districts to engage in sporting, recreational and cultural activities. In order to reach this goal, the Strategic Plan has been developed and it is hoped will be finalised in late January after a period of consultation from members.

November Meeting...

At the November meeting the committee approved painting the areas of the Recreation Hall most in need including toilets and wooden windows which are in dire need of an upgrade. The committee also has supported the Willunga Football Club in its proposal to erect a spectator and storage shed. The committee has approved the City of Onkaparinga holding a Tour Down Under Concert at the Recreation Park, which promises to be a fantastic event. Thanks to the City of Onkaparinga for the provision of an Emergency Response and Risk Management Plan for the Recreation Park to utilise for future events. Planning continues for the relining of the netball courts and the provision of shade for this area. Arrangements are well and truly underway for the 2008 Almond Blossom Festival which is our major fundraiser for the year and keeps the Recreation Park going. From preliminary discussions it appears that the Almond Blossom Festival will be bigger and better than ever. The Fleurieu Folk Festival was a great success and the Recreation Park Committee are pleased to have had the opportunity to assist and support this event. The Recreation Park Committee and its volunteers continue to work very hard to rectify ongoing maintenance issues.

New Beginnings...

January 2008

On Tuesday November 13th around 150 people, including a large number of children, gathered at the creek behind the old courthouse to celebrate reconciliation as Willunga's response to hosting the visit of the World Youth Day Cross, Icon and Message Stick. World Youth Day will be held next year in Sydney and is a celebration of faith for the youth of the world.

In Willunga, the local community used the day as a chance for a new beginning - to come in peace and with respect for the Aboriginal people and their culture and spirituality. The site where the ceremony was held is a traditional meeting area and is a beautiful and peaceful spot with the sound of the spring flowing through and the birds singing in the trees. We followed the young people



carrying the cross down to the stream where a group of Aboriginal people welcomed us with a fire ceremony. We walked through the cleansing smoke and watched as the message stick was presented to two young Kaurna men.



Tom Gleeson gave a moving speech highlighting the suffering of the Aboriginal people and led those gathered in an apology. The offering of peace brought about a hope for moving forward in unity, celebrating the richness of all peoples. Elder Georgina Williams responded graciously from the heart and invited Tom to place a stick on the fire with her as a symbol of a new, shared connection. Then we all joined in singing a special song celebrating creation, "Embrace with Peace and Love", written by Naomi Hicks.

After a procession down High Street to the Town Square, all those gathered were invited to commit to walking together for justice and peace on our journey towards reconciliation. There were suggestions made on how to do this in a practical way such as being involved in cross-cultural workshops; helping run art, craft, music and dance workshops with young people; being involved in a reconciliation study group and helping to commemorate the Kaurna people's connection with the site of the ceremony.

The celebration was completed with a shared lunch and more inspiring music by Kylie, Marty, Naomi and Tony. It was a very powerful and special time and more activities are planned for the new year.




