Bookings now open... If you want your Community Group "Showcased" on the InaNutshell front page, please let us know, so we can book you in the 2008 InaNutshell Diary.



Two WEC project officers...

Wayne Lawrence of "Restoring Balance"...

Wayne operates an environmental consultancy business from the Willunga Environment Centre that specializes in environmental restoration, water-course rehabilitation and project management. Wayne is currently managing numerous properties ranging in size from 5ha to 100's of ha on the Willunga-Sellicks escarpment, as well as helping to secure funding to rehabilitate the numerous water-courses that flow from the escarpment.



Wayne secures the funding that is required to assist landholders in repairing some of the damage that has been caused to a number of properties in the area. This may be fencing off water-courses so that stock do not have unlimited access to the creek-lines, it maybe revegetating sections of properties to arrest erosion issues or extend remnant vegetation or it maybe the removal of woody weeds.

Wayne brings extensive technical and local knowledge to the area having a degree in ecology gained from Flinders University and with his family living in the local area for a number of generations. 
