Since 1945, the Willunga RSL and Women's Auxiliary have supported ex-servicemen and war veterans.

They have done this in a number of ways...

1. raising money for RSL SA Branch's Veteran's accommodation; over 50 rental units in South Australia, two nursing homes and a war veterans home. Also twice a year parcels are sent to the troops overseas.

2. donating money to other charities that support war veterans and their dependents. This has included the McLaren Vale & Districts War Memorial Hospital.

3. providing clubrooms as a relaxed meeting place for members and their families. **Meetings are on the 2nd and 4th Friday of each month from 4pm onwards.** Facilities are licensed with pool table, darts and carpet bowls available. Up to thirty people of all ages attend.

Through the Willunga RSL, ex-servicemen and Veterans and their families can access information on pensions, counseling etc.

Families of ex-service personnel, police, firefighters and ambulance personnel are all eligible to join.

For gardeners considering introducing Australian natives to their garden, April is the ideal month to commence planting. There is still time to purchase and plant sweet peas. Come along to the Willunga Quarry Market on Saturday 12 April where native and many other varieties of plants, bulbs and Gawler Strain sweet pea seeds will be on sale from 9am to 1pm.

In a recent article in The Advertiser it was reported that almonds are a source of potassium, magnesium, phosphorous, riboflavin and vitamin E. This tasty nut could be simply described as nature's vitamin pill. Locally grown almonds are always available at the market, also honey, olives and olive oil.

The summer fruit harvest has kept the producers of jams,

sausages, chutney and fruit wraps busy in their kitchens during this long and hot summer. Freshly picked apricots, plums, figs peaches and summer berries, make delicious jams for spreading on toast, pancakes or crumpets or a jar of homemade jam makes an ideal gift. Sugar free fruit wraps are a healthy addition to school and work lunch boxes.

For the past 13 years, the town of Willunga and many of its associations have been extremely fortunate to benefit from the highly committed and dedicated Lois Koppen.

Of late, she has served as Secretary of the Willunga Business & Tourism Association, at a time when a revised constitution was unveiled along with a name change. And in her role, Lois has ensured that WBTA members and readers of this publication have been kept up to speed on recent developments.

In a selfish sense, we are saddened that Lois has decided to retire to the Rosetta Retirement Village in Victor Harbor and her last meeting is expected to be in May.

But, at the same time, we are delighted that Lois has found contentment in her life and we are confident that she will enjoy the beauty and serenity of Victor Harbor and its surrounds. Her cheerful manner will be sorely missed, although she intends to follow with interest the progress of the WBTA, and continue to assist with the typing of InaNutshell which she has found most rewarding.

"Volunteer work offers many rewards and I have many fond memories from what I did, and I also made many friends along the way," Lois said. "Victor is not that far away and I am sure I'll be around the town."

Working most of her married life due to a sick husband, she served as Manageress of the Airport Motel and the Atlantic Revolving Restaurant & Motel, where she was also involved in the official opening.

The long hours were not conducive to being away from Leo and she took a position as Senior Cruise Consultant with Murray River Cruises, something in which she could involve her husband.

"We would be involved in the Meeting and Greeting of passengers on arrival at the railway, airport and by bus every weekend, and I also took Leo on speciality cruises which I organised," Lois said.

After Leo's passing in 1991, she retired in 1993 moving to Moana Heights and was anxious to become involved in community work.

She was appointed Secretary of Friends of Willunga & Aldinga Libraries; Secretary to STARS and was also asked to take the minutes for the then Willunga Trade & Tourism Association. In 1999 she was subsequently appointed as Secretary of the WTTA and the Tour Down Under.

"I feel that I have been privileged to be involved in this work and I have gained much satisfaction and enjoyment. It now seems fitting that at the age of 83 it's time to slow down a bit," she said.

At the second Management Committee Meeting of the year, Howard Salkow welcomed Sue Caporn as a new committee member. She is joined by Brian Kowald (Brian Kowald Photography) and Albert Jamae (Jamaeraw Productions).

City of Onkaparinga Report...

Brian Hales addressed the meeting and provided background on the purchase of the McLaren Vale Visitors Information Centre by the City of Onkaparinga Council. Phillip Tanner outlined his position as the new manager of the Centre. He discussed proposed improvements and opportunities that would be considered. Concern was raised regarding the Gift Shop and whether "Made in Australia" goods would be on sale, and whether local suppliers would be considered when purchasing for the Centre. None of these questions received definitive responses. Phillip Tanner advised that the Centre would run at an annual loss of \$150,000 for the next five years.

New Members...

Howard advised that apart from the new members introduced to the Management Committee, additional new members included: – Caltex Service Station (Steve Davies); Willunga Recreation Park (Mark Adam); and the Willunga Hotel (John Hunt).

Signage...

Howard tabled a report by the City of Onkaparinga that detailed enforcement actions taken in relation to business signs in the last 12 months; and options on ways to address business signage needs and usage in the Council area.

He met and spoke to City officials who provided the appropriate background.

The City report, which offers four options for business signage, is planned to go before Council this month (April), it will then be presented to the Business Associations for consultation and then go back to Council.

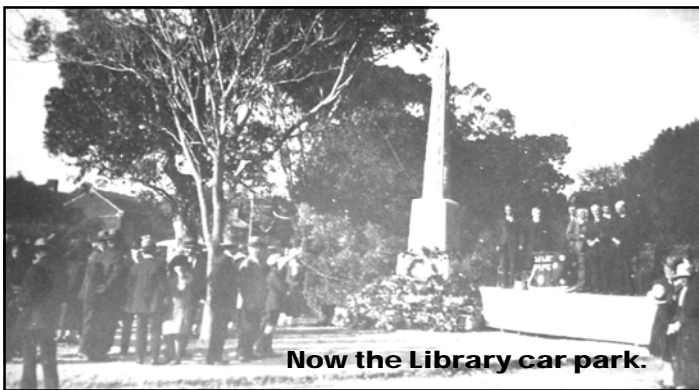
Returned Services League of Willunga... from 1944 to 2008

A meeting was convened by Mr P G Malpas in March 1944 to discuss the formation of a Sub-Branch in Willunga of the Returned Sailors' Soldiers' & Airmens Imperial League of Australia. Twenty men attended.

A Sub-Branch Provisional Committee of five members was formed with Mr Malpas as chairman and Mr J Haworth as minute secretary. The other members were; Messrs Martin, Evans and O'Neill.

The Willunga Sub-Branch of the RSSAILA was officially opened by the State President Sir Eric Millhouse March 17th, 1945.

The RSSAILA was renamed nationally in 1965 to become the Returned Services League of Australia (RSL).

Before the clubrooms were built, meetings were held in the Anglican Parish Hall, Oddfellows Hall, the Show Hall and Aldinga Hall.

Wartime Fundraising...

These were difficult times, with many of Willunga's sons fighting overseas, and fund raising for the new club was not an easy task.

Dances were held at Willunga and Aldinga to raise funds, and the Willunga Racing Club also contributed. One very successful function was a children's picnic held at Aldinga Beach. Whilst a club house was the goal, funds were also donated to many charities such as "Food For Britain", the Southern Districts War Memorial Hospital, War Widows, Limbless Soldiers and Legacy.

Clubrooms...

Mr Malpas donated the blocks of land on the corner of St Peter's Terrace and High Street where the current library is situated, and suggested a building consisting of three rooms be built. The Willunga Council financially supported the venture to the tune of 1/3 total cost up to £3000. One room was to be a Council Chamber, one a rest room and the third, the RSL Clubroom.

Building commenced in 1956 with Perce Herring and Bill Blackburn assisted by club members laying the foundations. The lining of ceiling and walls was done by Mr Bill Symonds for £228-10-00.

The RSL clubrooms were officially opened by the State President Mr A J Lee on the 12th of October 1957.

RSL Activities...

A youth group was formed and the President, Mr Gordon Miller and Mrs Pannach gave the group dancing lessons. The facilities were also used by Red Cross and many other community groups.

Willunga RSL is part of the Alexandra Group which at that time included McLaren Vale, Mt Compass, Yankalilla, Port Elliot, Goolwa, and Victor Harbor Sub-Branches.

These Sub-Branches combined under the chairmanship of Gordon Miller to raise funds for the War Veterans Home. They started with Rodeos in the early years and then to annual Golf Weeks at Victor Harbor and South Lakes and finally to clay target shooting. Over 25 years the Willunga RSL and Willunga RSL Women's Auxiliary have raised a considerable amount for the War Veterans Home, which was built in Myrtle Bank.

Clubrooms at Rec. Park...

The Almond Blossom Festival inspired the Willunga Recreation Park committee to build a larger hall. In May 1978 the Recreation Park committee had discussions with the RSL committee regarding rooms in the new hall. It was agreed that the RSL sell its clubrooms and place some of the proceeds with Willunga Rec Park to assist in building the new hall in which the RSL was to have a dedicated room. The RSL sold the original clubrooms to Jeff Mason of Main Electrical for \$30,000 after costs, and paid \$20,000 to Willunga Rec Park.

The CWA entered into a similar arrangement and they also have a dedicated room, and share kitchen and wash room facilities with the RSL.

Willunga Community Centre was opened in August 1979 and at a later date the War Memorial was moved from its original site, which is now the library car park, to its present site in front of the main hall. The Dawn Service is held here at 6.15 am each Anzac Day.

Some stellar leadership... has been given to the Willunga RSL. Eric Rowley, a Vietnam veteran, served as Treasurer for 9 years and was President for a further 15 years until the end of 2007. Mos Hancock, also a Vietnam veteran was elected President and Membership Officer at the recent AGM. Ken Chinner also was a valuable member of the club as Treasurer for many years. The current Secretary, Howie Spencer has held that position for the last fourteen years, as well as Treasurer for the last four.

Today, Willunga RSL continue to support ex service personnel in a variety of ways. See more on next page...

Willunga RSL Women's Auxiliary...

In 1978, as a result of an influx of new families settling into the district, the RSL President called a general meeting resulting in the re-opening of the Women's Auxiliary. Nine ladies from Willunga and Aldinga Districts attended the first meeting. They elected President, Secretary and Treasurer and affiliated with the Central Council of Women's Auxiliaries.

Many, many fundraising functions were arranged. Combined annual picnic days at Myrtle Bank War Veterans Home providing barbeque lunches, drinks, cakes, sweets and entertainment for the residents of the home have been a great success.

Other fundraising activities include street stalls, selling home-made produce; raffles for Easter egg baskets, mock wedding & christening evenings, annual clay target shoots, picnic days, fashion parade & luncheon afternoons, annual golf days, RSL dinners and many, many more. All functions are catered for by the Auxiliary.

Each ANZAC and Remembrance Day, auxiliary members sell badges in the Willunga main street. The proceeds go to the Poppy Day Trust for accommodation for War Service Veterans. Over the last 30 years, Willunga RSL Auxiliary has raised and handed over large sums of money.

RSL cares for the Ex-Service person...

In meeting the goal of caring for the Ex-Service person the SA Branch has various aged accommodation facilities:

Independent Living Units-Darby and Joan Cottages...

The RSL owns a number of one and two bedroom units in South Australia for rent by applicants in necessitous circumstances. There are a total of 51 units in 5 villages, 36 in the metropolitan area and 15 in country areas.

Campbelltown, at 15 Cedar Ave, 16 one bedroom units
Clovelly Park, at 20-22 Oak Ave, 10 two bedroom units
Mount Gambier, at 7 Holder St, 7 one bedroom units
Semaphore, at 63 Esplanade, 10 one bedroom units
Walleroo, at 1 Irwin St, 8 one bedroom units

The purpose of the units is to provide aged independent accommodation for those Ex-Service persons, or their widows/widowers, or their dependants, still capable of caring for their own needs.

Nursing Home Accommodation...

This is accommodation for persons who have been medically assessed as requiring a level of care.

RSL Villas 18 Trafford St, Angle Park SA. Provides Hostel and Respite accommodation only.

RSL Villas is a fifty five bed Aged Care Facility catering for residents with Low Care needs. Priority for places is given to members of the Ex-Service community and their dependents.

This fully accredited facility promotes the comfort, individuality and dignity of residents, within the ethos and traditions of the RSL. It also contains a secure area for residents with the special needs of Dementia as well as Respite facilities.

The War Veterans Home Myrtle Bank...

honours and cares for our ex-service personnel and their dependants. It has the highest reputation for quality care and services at its recently re-built and refurbished club style facilities within the Alexandra Park setting.

Three levels of accommodation are available on site:

1. Resident funded units - where people live independently
2. Hostel - single rooms with ensuite facilities for 69 High/Low Care Residents. Ageing in place is supported and we have a wing providing specialised Dementia care to 20 Residents. Respite services are also available.

3. Bangka Wing provides single, shared accommodation and Respite for 26 High Care Residents.

Services provided include regular outings, church services, hairdressing, physiotherapy, choice of visiting doctor and an active Resident's Advisory Committee and Resident's meetings to help keep all involved and informed. War Veterans Home

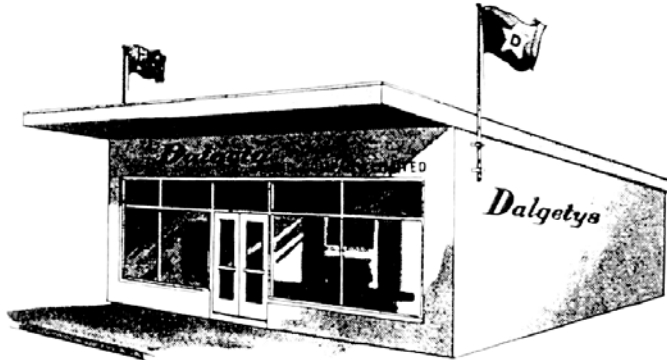

Almond Men form Trust...

The formation of an almond industry trust fund committee was announced by the Minister of Agriculture, (Mr. Casey) yesterday. Mr. Casey said Co-Operative Almond Producers Ltd. had nominated Mr. E.H. Lacey and Mr. R.T. Martin, both of Willunga to represent almond producers on the committee.

Mr. R.L. Wishart, senior horticultural adviser with the Department of Agriculture, had been appointed chairman. Mr. B.T. Barker, the department's district officer involved with the industry, was the fourth member of the committee and also its secretary.

Mr. Casey said the trust fund would be paid for by grants from the almond industry. An initial grant of \$1,000 had been made and the committee would apply to the Commonwealth Department of Primary Industry for a matching grant.

One of the first matters the committee would consider would be an investigation into the likely causes of the poor cropping of Chellaston almonds over the past two seasons. 1972

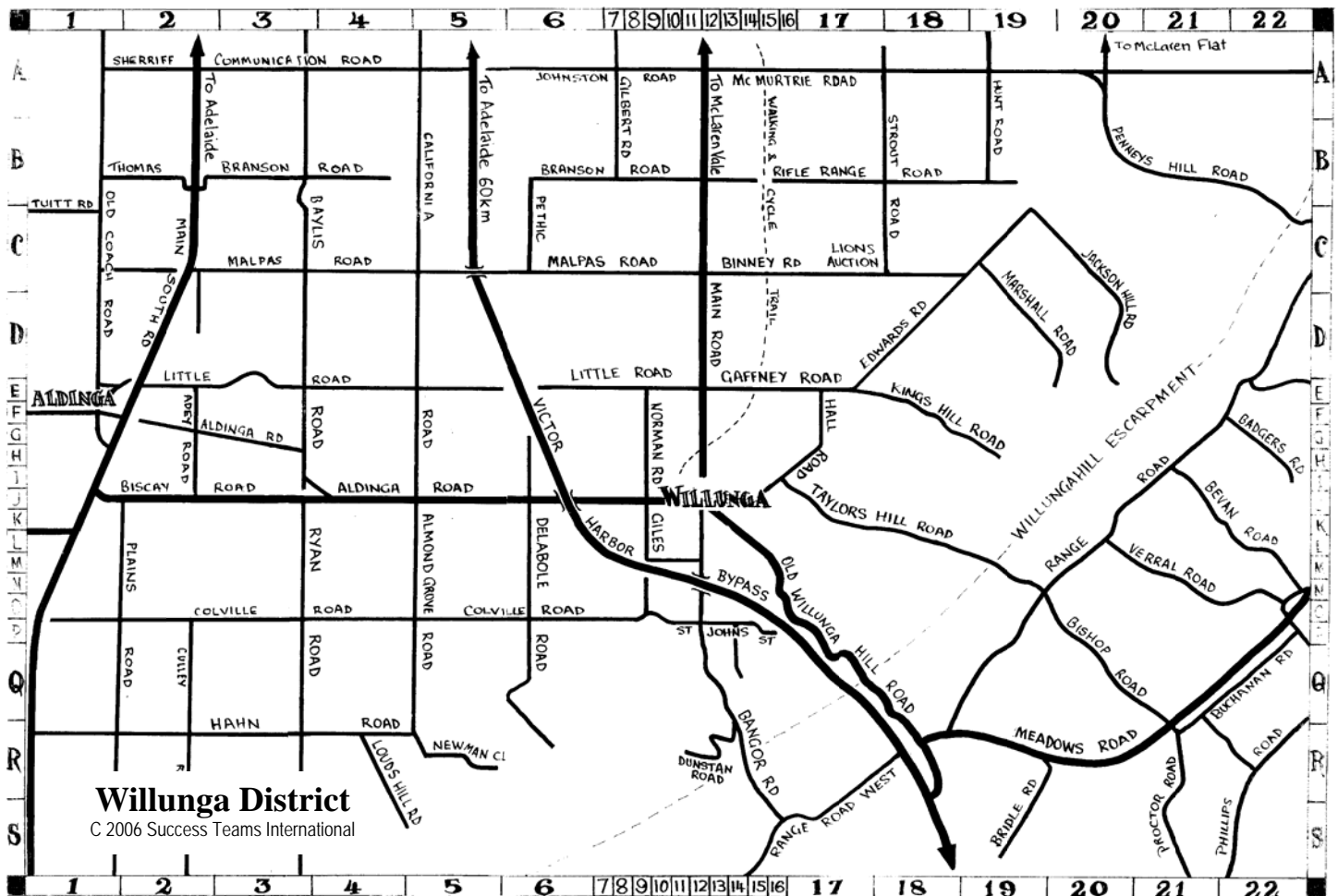
