STARS is an acronym for Southern Theatre and **AR**ts Supporters.

STARS started life in 1989 as Friends of Noarlunga College Theatre. In 1995 the name was changed to STARS and in 2000 lease negotiations took place with the Onkaparinga Council for STARS to operate Waverley Homestead as a venue for Community Art and Cultural Centre.

## STARS...Promoters of the Arts

STARS is a group of people who keep the arts alive. The membership is increasing and the committee members seek to promote access to the arts for all the community.

Waverley Homestead is one of the oldest homes in South Australia still available for community use and STARS presents concerts, art exhibitions and other entertainment and acto music overlooking a setting of majestic River Red gums and a creek – this view is little different from the scene of over a hundred years ago.

For the first two weeks in August, STARS will be staging Nature's Echo, a SALA (South Australian Living Artists) event and Art Exhibition featuring the works of Jane Burbidge, Céline Donegan and Jenny Pedlar. #### Tribe FM: a going and green concern...

Tribe FM is now a community-based incorporated body that is committed to establishing a community radio station in the Willunga/Aldinga area and will be holding their first annual general meeting on Saturday 16 August 2008, 4-6pm at Waverley Homestead. Over the past year, Tribe FM has been growing support from local businesses, community organisations and local people. Even Mike Rann has signed their petition of support for a temporary broadcasting licence.

#### Voice for businesses & community groups...

Tribe FM will be a community voice for all businesses, community organisations and people in the Willunga/Aldinga area. It will work hard to give young people, indigenous and people on low incomes and with disabilities special access to their productions and programming. Of great importance to the founders of Tribe FM is to make it work as a "green" radio station. They will achieve this by ensuring their building is solar powered, fitted with water and grey-water tanks, geared up to recycling waste and that all its programs carry the "green" environmental message wherever possible.

#### Community Radio Vacuum...

The Willunga/Aldinga area is currently in a community radio vacuum. We are at least 45 kilometres from Coast FM at Glandore or Encounter FM at Victor Harbor. That is a round trip of nearly 100kms. Imagine a community station in our own backyard? Tribe FM are currently making an application to the Australian Communications and Media Authority for a temporary licence.

#### General Ward Update...

Rates link provides rating information; Climate Change Strategy link takes you to this document relevant to the Community Plan. The community engagement link will take you to a listing of all community engagements; have a look at the status board it's a new item on the council website covering ongoing community engagements across the City of Onkaparinga, happy to help out here if anyone has any queries with the links and or content.

**Integrated Transport Strategy...** Submissions are invited on Councils draft Integrated Transport Strategy 2008-2013, by 30 August 2008. The strategy has the goal of achieving an integrated transport system designed to meet the future needs of our communities and our economy. The strategies are grouped around the themes of: Public Transport, Walking and Cycling, Community Transport, Roads Freight and Tourism. Download the draft here Integrated Transport Strategy 2008-2013 (1.1Mb) or call me and I can post a copy.

Water Proofing the South... is a localised integrated water resource management strategy based entirely in the City of Onkaparinga. Stage 1 of the Project aims to deliver 3.8GL (3800ML) of agricultural, viticultural and urban reuse and 1.1GL (1100ML) of additional storage which facilitates the anticipated level of reuse. The City of Onkaparinga has received \$34.5 million National `Water Initiative funding (administered by the National Water Commission) for the implementation of the City of Onkaparinga's and SA Water's elements of the Project. by rail and a licence was required to remove and tranship good from the railway stations. T.C.B. or the Transport Control Board restricted the movement of goods wherever a goods train operated. During the war years, Sam was enlisted in the army while his brother Mick ran the General Store at Morphett Vale, later known as the Four Square Store.

Sam lived in the house in the main street of Old Noarlunga, which was called the Bank. Mick lived and ran the depot on the Main Road McLaren Vale where the Coles Shop-

This year, Southern Transport, which began in 1939 and was operated by the McDonald family for 69 years, ceases operations.

Transport and society has changed much in the years the McDonalds and Southern Transport has been serving South Australia from their Willunga headquarters.

The original company was founded in 1939 by two brothers, Scott and Sam McDonald when they purchased two vehicles at Willunga. Prior to moving to Willunga, the McDonald brothers lived at Old Noarlunga where they grew peas and carted vegetables to Adelaide Markets.

Sam, the youngest of the family moved to Willunga to manage the business, but after six months returned to the original home at Old Noarlunga and Scott the second eldest son moved to Willunga with his wife and young family to organise and run the carrying company, then known as **McDonald's Willunga Carrying Service**.

The two brothers were joined later in the business by their elder brother Arnold (Mick). Depots for the business operated at Old Noarlunga, McLaren Vale and Willunga.

#### The earlier years...

In 1939 to late 1950 all goods to these areas were transported

ping Centre is now, then moved to Aldersy Street.

During the war, petrol was rationed and Scott would have to burn timber in pits to make coke for the gas producers which were fitted to the vehicles.

Geoffrey Ellbourn (King), Merv Ellbourn (Herb), Ern Thiele, Murray Ellbourn (Mot), Bert Dowling, Reg Spilsbury and George Bevan were employed during the 1940's era.

#### Two businesses formed in 1956...

In 1956 the partnership was dissolved and Mick McDonald continued on his own and called this business McLaren Vale Transport, later changed to **Dean's Transport** owned and operated by John his grandson. Mick died and his daughter Margaret and husband Roy operated the business.

The carrying business at Willunga changed it's name to **Southern Transport Pty Ltd** in 1956. Sam died in 1973 and Scott passed away in January 1974.

The business passed to members of both families and in 1986 ownership flowed to Scott's family. Barry, Philip, Christopher and Richard ran and operated as... "McDonald Family Transport trading as Southern Transport Pty Ltd".

With Scott and Sam's retirement in the middle 1960's Barry, who began work in 1954, took over the reins as Manager of the transport until ill health forced him to retire in October, 1999.

Phil, who had commenced work in 1961, took over from Arthur Sorrell as Secretary/Accountant in the late 1960's. Arthur purchased the timber business from Mr Lawrence in High Street (now the Willunga Glass Studio) which he ran with his wife Betty for several years. Christopher and Richard, who had worked out on the road since 1965 and 1967 respectfully, filled the void after Barry's departure as Transport Manager.

#### Loaded the first SA ship with livestock...

Southern Transport loaded the very first vessel from Port Adelaide with livestock for the Middle East in 1968. Since then all loading of export sheep has been organised and trucked by Southern Transport Pty Ltd, to Outer Harbor until this day. Some of the ships **loaded 120,000 sheep at a time**, which involved **40 semis** working 2/3 day shifts.

Before Metro Meat Noarlunga closed, sheep were transported **from Gepps Cross** to the killing works. 6,000 odd sheep were carted on the Tuesday and Wednesday each week with cattle every Monday.

**Thousands of sheep and cattle** have left the Fleurieu area for different destinations, some to the South East, Murray Bridge, Victoria and throughout South Australia aboard Southern Transport's trucks.

**Grape cartage** has been a seasonal bonus with grapes being transported to the Barossa Valley, New South Wales and locally.

### Nearly One Thousand Drivers...

Over the years nearly 1000 drivers have either been trained or learnt to drive semi trailers and trucks. One of these was Ern Thiele's son Robert John (Jack—aged 15) who off-sided for his father doing what was called the town run. They would leave Willunga Depot for Franklin Street City Depot to load their vehicle with general freight. Deliveries were to O'Halloran Hill General Store (now demolished) then on to Reynella to the Hotel, Woolcocks General Store, through to Morphett Vale, Noarlunga, McLaren Vale and Willunga.

Jack did this for several years until he obtained his licence to drive a motor vehicle. Jack has done a variety of work including carting sheep, fuel, milk and tallow. He has put his hand to most assignments required of him. Congratulations to Jack on serving this Company for 51 years this February, 2008. Nine of Southern Transport's employees have totalled up 397 years collectively, working for the same firm, including three generations of Ellbourns.

#### Willunga thanks the McDonald family...

...for providing employment and service. We all offer each of the McDonald family members our best wishes as they move out of an activity that has been such a major part of three generations of McDonalds for almost one half of Willunga's entire history.
