

Willunga to host TheatreSports Season...

Willunga is to host the first ever TheatreSports Season in South Australia to be conducted outside the CBD. Yes, in the past, we have had a number of very successful one off shows, but this will be the first complete series and co-ordinator Jeff Simmons is looking for players.

TheatreSports, the hilarious inspiration for "Who's Line is it Anyway" and "Thank God You're Here" is improvised comedy where teams make up and act out stories based on audience suggestions. Teams improvise scenes following wacky game structures and do whatever it takes to satisfy the judges and entertain the audience.

Having hosted two very successful seasons in the 2008 Adelaide Fringe, local theatre company Impro NOW! is now offering the same opportunity to the south. This season will be conducted in Willunga over four consecutive Saturdays in commencing on November 22.

Classes for those who wish to experience this comedy improvisation commence Monday September 8. It's a lot easier than it looks. You start gradually, breaking down inhibitions with laughter, building trust with support activities, and playing games to develop individual and group story telling skills. As your confidence improves, the trickier games are introduced.

Playing TheatreSports for some is stress release, for others it builds creativity, self confidence or spontaneity, but for everyone it's a great belly laugh working with, rather than against others in a fun supportive atmosphere. At the end of the course, players can choose to perform in the subsequent season.

Jeff and Anne Simmons hold the International TheatreSports License for South Australia and Australian TheatreSports Coaching Certification. They have trained in Canada with Keith Johnstone (the creator of TheatreSports), in Sydney with Lynne Pierse (author of TheatreSports Down Under) and have been teaching improvisation since 2002.

Willunga Chamber Orchestra concert...

On Sunday September 21st at 2.30pm the Willunga Chamber Orchestra is presenting an afternoon concert of classical pieces under the musical direction of Wendy Dyson from the Willunga Suzuki Music School.

Entry is \$5.00 for adults and children under 14 are free (tickets at the door, no booking required) and all proceeds will be donated to the Fred Hollows Foundation.

This interesting concert begins with two short works by contemporary composers. The first, Rockin' Jammin' Swingin', is a lively syncopated work by Soon Hee Newbold. Soon Hee is a very active musician (violin and piano), conductor and composer and has won many prestigious competitions. This piece is influenced by styles of blues, jazz and early rock. 'Diversity' is another modern work by Carold Nunez, now a fulltime professional composer and pianist in Texas. Diversity has a solo viola part which will be played by Julia Easterbrook, leader of the viola section. 'Simple Symphony' is not really simple! It was composed by Benjamin Britten, a 20th century English composer and pianist, between the ages of nine and twelve. The Symphony has four parts and is well-known, especially for the lively 'Playful Pizzicato' played entirely by plucking, rather than bowing, the strings. The last piece from 'Rodeo' is by Aaron Copland, widely considered the most famous American composer, capturing the feeling of America and its people.

This group of musicians have developed into a real team led by the dedicated and inspiring Wendy Dyson. Wendy selected a wonderful programme for 2008 which was applauded by all ages from 2 to 90. It included the stirring Pirates of the Caribbean and for the classical fans Mozart's Magic Flute overture. Plus compositions by Wendy written especially for the Youth Orchestra.

The tour began with a performance at Willunga Primary school, with many students keen to ask questions. It then moved on to the Southern Vales Christian School in Aldinga, where many parents also enjoyed the performance.

The orchestra then convoyed down to Goolwa for a performance at the Investigator school. This was special for several members of the orchestra who had attended this school and teachers commented on how the orchestra was getting better and better.

The tour then stopped for a well needed lunch break in Goolwa before finishing at the Thornbury Park Retirement Estate. A new audience full of anticipation and whose manager also included

afternoon tea for the orchestra.

As part of the orchestra cheer squad I was able to hear something new in each performance and see the focus put into each performance. The tour ended with the after party, always something to look forward to and a great way to relax and share the highlights of the day.

A parent made special comment that she loved the Wendy Dyson piece entitled Dark Adventure, another was very proud to hear her children do an extra solo piece at the Southern Vales. But perhaps the best comment came from a pre school aged girl at the end of the day. Loudly wishing to the audience that she had brought her own violin, so she could have joined in on Twinkle, Twinkle Little Star. It was the sense after listening to this orchestra that you wanted to be part of it and the rousing and mysterious sounds it produced.



Eighty years old this month...

Two meetings in September 1928, lead to the formation of the Willunga Bowling Club. The annual subscription was set at four guineas; a guinea being one pound one shilling or twenty one shillings (\$8.40). The land for the construction of a green was given by H Allen. President F G Culley donated twenty-five pounds (\$50) to start fundraising, and members were offered five pound (\$10) debentures at 6%.

An early landmark for the club was a cypress hedge planted to act as a wind break before the green was laid. This landmark continued in position until 1981/82 when it was removed in two stages. Before the end of the club's first month it was decided to install a pump on the club premises where water was available, and the secretary was authorised to buy the seed for the planting of the green.

At the first annual general meeting in August, 1929, it was decided to affiliate with the SA Bowling Association. The first club championship was played in 1931 for a trophy presented by the president. Handicap singles and pairs were also played. The entry fee was two shillings (20c) for the championship, and one shilling (10c) for the other events.

Lights installed...

Lights were installed on two rinks in 1934 with a minimum fee of four shillings (40c) for play, or sixpence (5c) per member, with the lights to be out by 10.30 pm. The lights were extended to the whole green in 1938.

In September 1931 it was decided to build a clubhouse providing the cost was kept within 35 pounds (\$70), and the following year a cement floor was laid. Extensions were made to the building in 1946, when the president W Ellis met the cost of all materials, while the club found the labour. In 1958 a legacy

of 5000 pounds (\$10,000) left by Sydney Norman in his will to the club enabled them to build a new clubhouse which was called the Sydney Norman Memorial clubhouse. In 1969 extensions southward were completed and furnished.

The club experienced difficulty in carrying on in the 1939-45 war years, but additional land was bought on the north side of the green in 1945.

Willunga members have recorded several successes in country carnivals. In 1952 Lloyd Leverington won the country singles. The fours were won in 1953 (M Martin, H Waye, M Liddy, F Nocholds) and the pairs in 1957 (M Martin, F Evans) and 1975 (V & M Keelan).

Ladies join in...

In response to a request from some interested women, Michael Nolan, president of the club, called a meeting in 1954 to ascertain if enough women wished to play bowls. In November 1954 the women joined the club and the subscription was set at one guinea (\$2.10).

A handful of women gathered together without any bowling experience, without finance, but with a determination to make a success of their bowls. They soon began fundraising with cake



stalls etc and members tried to learn the art of bowling mainly by trial and error.

Many interesting tales could be told of their efforts. Membership began to increase and at the end of the first year it stood at nineteen. At a meeting held at Port Noarlunga on November 10, 1955 the Southern Women's Bowling Association was formed, consisting of Willunga, Port Noarlunga, Morphett Vale and Clarendon

The club has developed from a humble beginning to become one of the busiest in the association. The Southern Association now consists of twelve clubs with three divisions competing for a pennant. Willunga enters a side in both Division One and Two.

For young and old...

Willunga Bowling Club has bowlers from as far away as Pt

Noarlunga South through to Sellicks Beach.

Our youngest member is twelve years and our oldest is ninety (and he beats everyone!). Out of a total membership of around 90, we have a number of folks under 25 and are especially looking for more in this age group.

How it works...

Bowls clubs are involved in social (non competitive activities) and inter-club competitions. In the competitions, they compete against one another at division level (graded according to ability) to win the pennant for their level.

Willunga's women's teams compete in the Southern Women's Bowling Association and the men are in the Great Southern Bowling Association. The Women's teams compete against about eight town teams from Yankalilla to Happy Valley. The men's teams also compete with about eight other teams that include Langhorne Creek and Strathalbyn.




