National Trust News...

The recent re-roofing of the Court House building has provided a much needed improvement to the appearance of this heritage-listed building, as well as preventing the possibility of leaks and water damage through the old roof. Insulation was installed at the same time, as well as an upgrade of the power points in the Court House. This was arranged and funded by the City of Onkaparinga which is the owner of the building.

We understand that there have been some proposed additions and deletions from the Council's Local Heritage list and that the full report is available at Council Offices including Willunga. If you are interested in these issues, we recommend you look at the Local Heritage Development Plan Amendment Draft and make your comments by 24th October.

Showcasing Willunga Quarry Market Inc...

Established 1986

Held on second Saturday every month 9am to 1pm.

Location: Aldinga Road WILLUNGA between Willunga Hardware & CFS.

The Willunga Quarry Market was the brainchild of Megan Guster, Sally French-Kennedy and Jenny Peterson (who served as treasurer up until June 2007). The following quote is from the Proposal to Willunga District Council dated September 1986.

"Short term aim: to explore the possibilities of establishing a market for the use of local people in marketing their skills and produce to both local people and tourists.

Long-term aim: to establish a regular and permanent market that will enhance and develop the historic and rural character of Willunga and provide fulfilment for the people in the district interested in supplementing their incomes through personal skills and / or home grown produce."

Having negotiated with Ian & Miriam Collett, to use their disused quarry (which is alongside the Willunga National Trust Court House and Police Station Museum), questionnaires were circulated throughout the district.



There was a good response, so negotiations commenced with the Willunga District Council and the WILLUNGA QUARRY MARKET was registered as an Incorporated Association on 20 November 1986.


Willunga District Council rejected the quarry as a suitable site for a market and offered a site on Linear Park for the inaugural market on Saturday 6 December 1986, which was held from 9am to 3pm. Some of the 32 stallholders at the first market are still living in the district, these include: Adrian Strachan, Rosie Knott, Chris Glaetzer, Alison Leaney, Joan Hudd and Dave Clarke.

Council had development plans for Linear Park and so negotiations took place with the Willunga Scout Group to use their site on the corner of Aldinga Road and Railway Terrace on the second Saturday monthly. The Willunga Quarry Market was held on the Willunga Scout Grounds from 11 April 1987 to 29 September 2001.

To make way for the long awaited return of the Willunga Netball Club to the Willunga Recreation Park Inc. fold, the Willunga Quarry Market relocated to our present site on the oval grounds on Saturday 13 October 2001.

In 1991 Joan Turner then Willunga Almond Blossom Festival coordinator approached committee to hold a market on the last Saturday in July to support and extend the festival. The first market supporting the WABF was held on Willunga Recreation Park Grounds and was a complete wash out. The following year the Market returned to the Scout Grounds for this annual event. The last Willunga Quarry Market, Almond Blossom Festival Market was held July 2007.

From 2001 to 2005 we held five successful Dolls Bears and Miniatures Fairs and Spring Garden & Produce Markets as part of 'Weekend in Willunga'. The demise of these highly successful



events was the inability to attract new volunteers.

More Willunga Quarry Market's milestones:

11 years support with sponsorship and planning for the Tour Down Under.

Receiving a Certificate of Encouragement at the 1999 inaugural Fleurieu Tourism Awards. Presented by the Hon. Joan Hall MP, the Minister for Tourism.


Participating in Willunga's 160th Anniversary of Settlement in

The printing of our first coloured DL Market brochure in 2000.



Getting the Market gear onsite entailed transporting two trailer loads of paraphernalia to the site and back. In 2002 we had saved enough money to build our own storage shed.

In the same year we sponsored the Tick Toe at the Onkaparinga Playground.

July 2003 featured in Postcards in July and in their annual book.

In 2004 www.willungaquarrymarket.com was launched.




